Inland Truck Parts Opens New Drive-In Service Center in Hunt Midwest Business Center North Kansas City location puts parts and repair operation nearer to customer base

KANSAS CITY, Mo – June 8, 2009 – Inland Truck Parts (ITP) Company (www.inlandtruck.com) recently opened a new 65,000 SF service center at 8801 NE Parvin Road in the Hunt Midwest Business Center. Inland purchased 8.23 acres of land in early 2008 in order to build this state-of-the-art facility.

The NE Parvin Road location replaces a legacy facility in the urban core of Kansas City, Mo. The company made the move in order to be closer to its customer base and to consolidate its parts operation with the new drive-in service center, according to Jim Adams, general manager of the new operation. The new ITP facility is approximately one mile from I-435, which accommodates nearly 65,500 vehicles per day.

“It made a lot of sense for us to be near the truck dealers,” said Adams. “This is also a good area for trucks to get in and out of easily and highway accessibility is excellent.”

Established in 1944, Inland Truck Parts is an employee-owned company specializing in truck parts, remanufacturing, and service. ITP inventories a broad range of parts for all makes and models of trucks and trailers from the industry’s leading manufacturers. Service center locations remanufacture manual and automatic transmissions, differentials, transfer cases and drivelines.

“Inland’s arrival at the Hunt Midwest Business Center is further evidence of the demand for transportation service businesses in this area,” said Dick Ringer, assistant general manager of Hunt Midwest. “The volume of truck traffic along the I-435 corridor is substantial, and we believe Inland Truck Parts will have great success at this location.”
